

About your forest

Potters Meadow

Potters Meadow is almost 7 hectares (equivalent to around 14 football pitches) and supported under the UK's National Forest scheme. Designated a 'Community Woodland', local schools and villages and towns have been invited to get involved in planting events, and the site is available to schools as an educational resource between Key Stages 1 and 2. It's invaluable for children to have this kind of direct interaction with the environment.

The western border of this new woodland runs along a watercourse, and a series of dammed pools run through the centre, creating areas of wetland. Planting is predominately with native broadleaves and, in particular, oak, ash and silver birch.

You will find picnic tables set out in glades dotted throughout the forest.



Directions

The nearest town to the woodland is Barton Under Needwood, Staffordshire. The site itself is located at Wychnor Bridge. Follow the A38 northwards past Alrewas. Turn left at Wychnor Bridge towards Wychnor. Follow this road for 1,500 metres, where there is a turning to the left through a field gate into a small grassy car parking area. The entrance sign points the way to the site to the south of the car park.
