

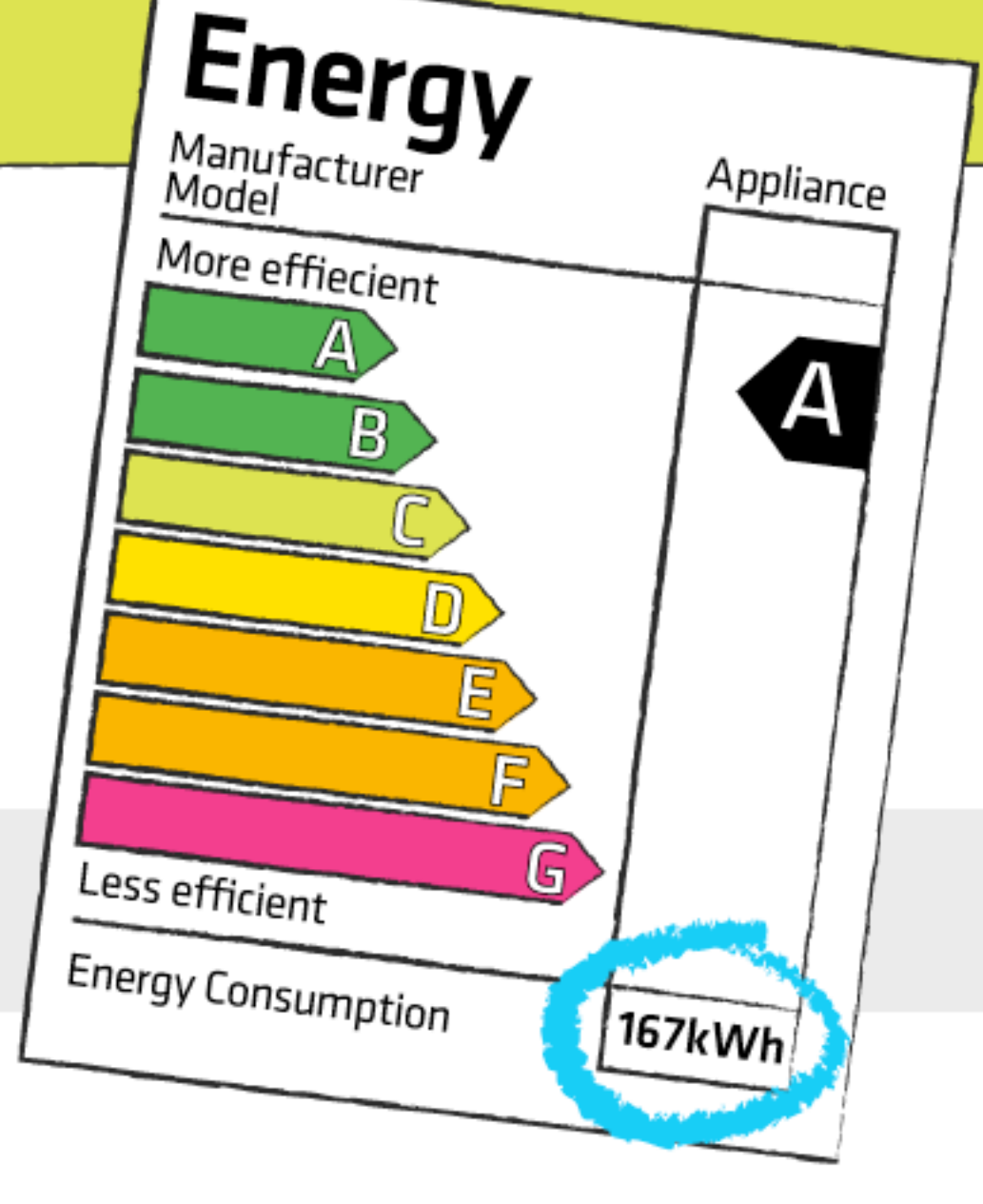

If you're thinking of replacing anything from a cooker to a kettle, it can pay to check the energy rating first.

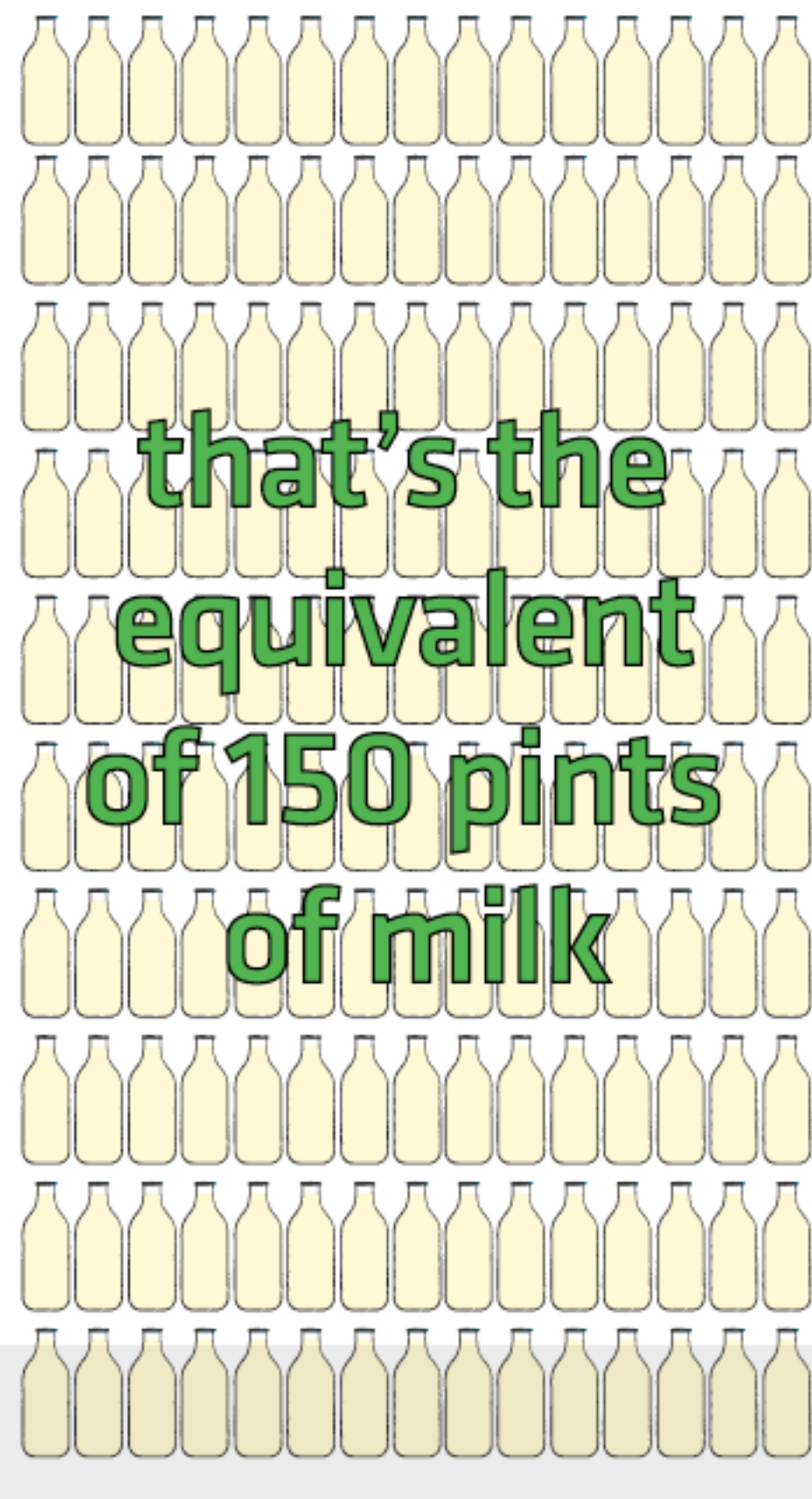
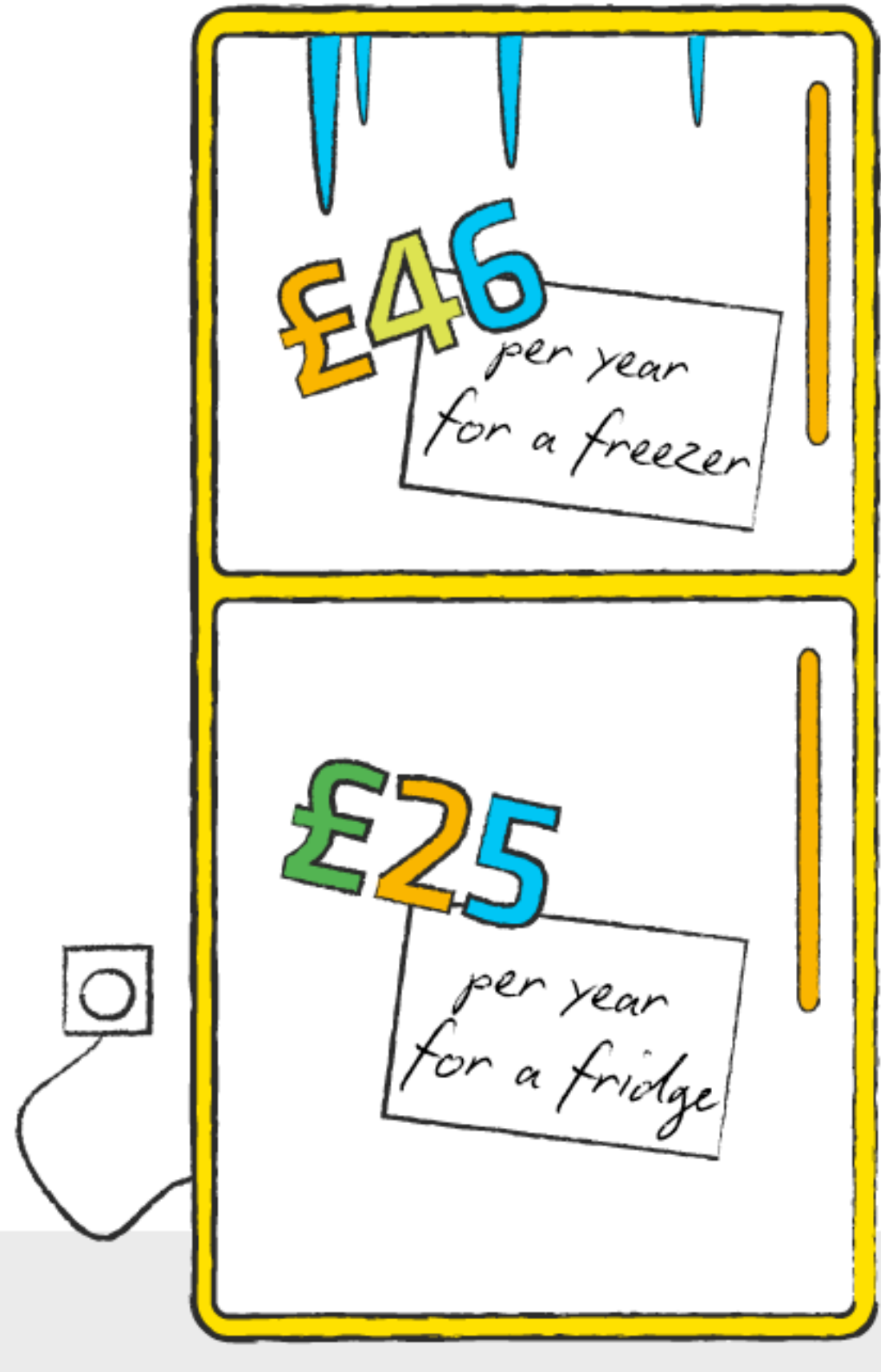
Check the energy label

Most white goods come with an energy rating. The lower the 'kWh/annum' in the bottom right, the more energy efficient it is. Buying the most energy efficient one can make a real difference to your bill each year*.

Save up to £71 a year by choosing the most efficient fridge and freezer.



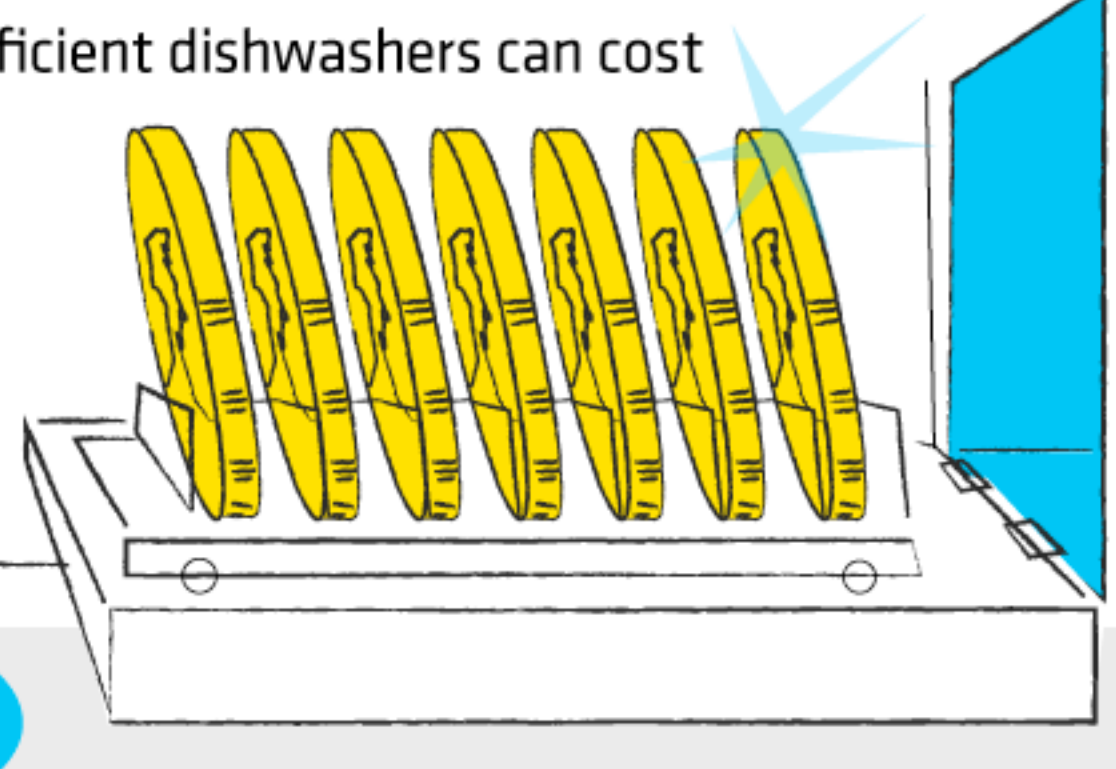

Keep your dishes sparkling and your wallet happy. Efficient dishwashers can cost

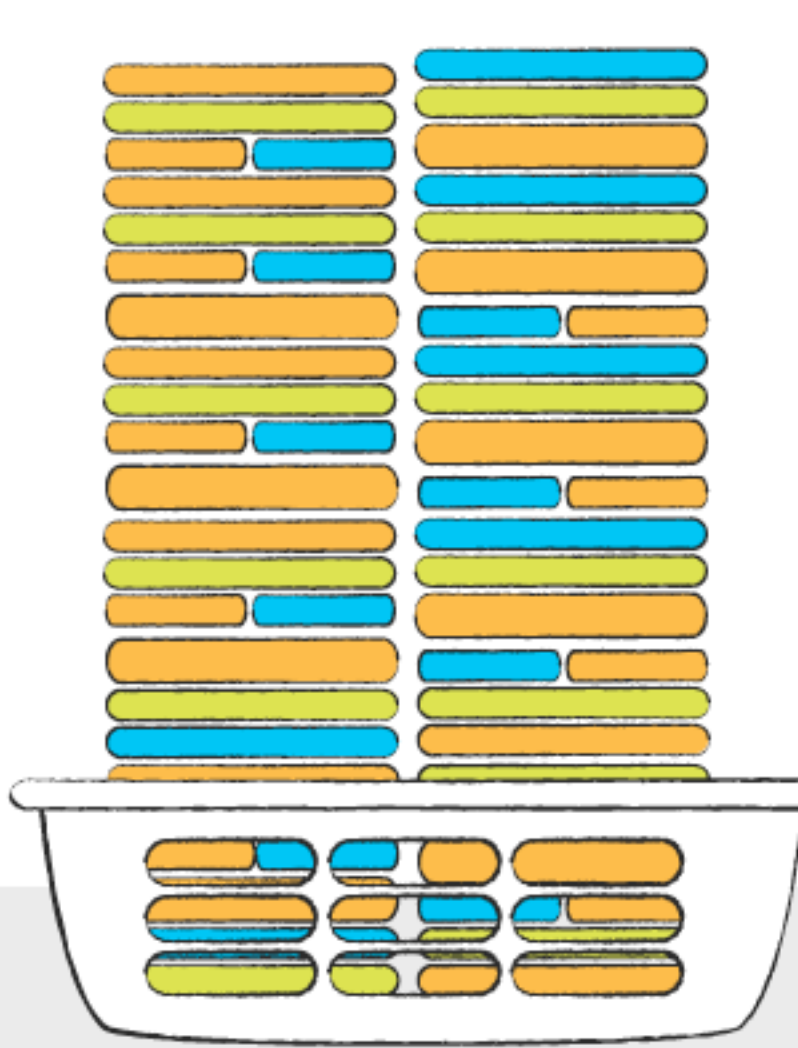
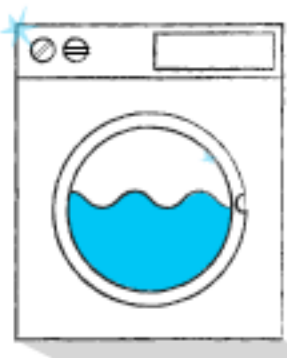
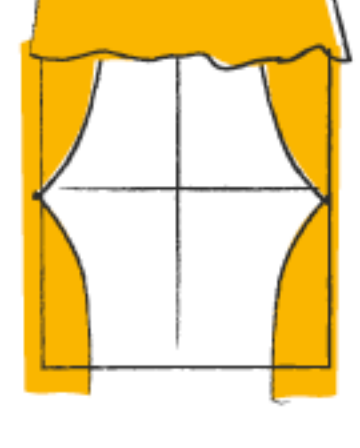

An energy efficient washing machine could save as much as **£35**

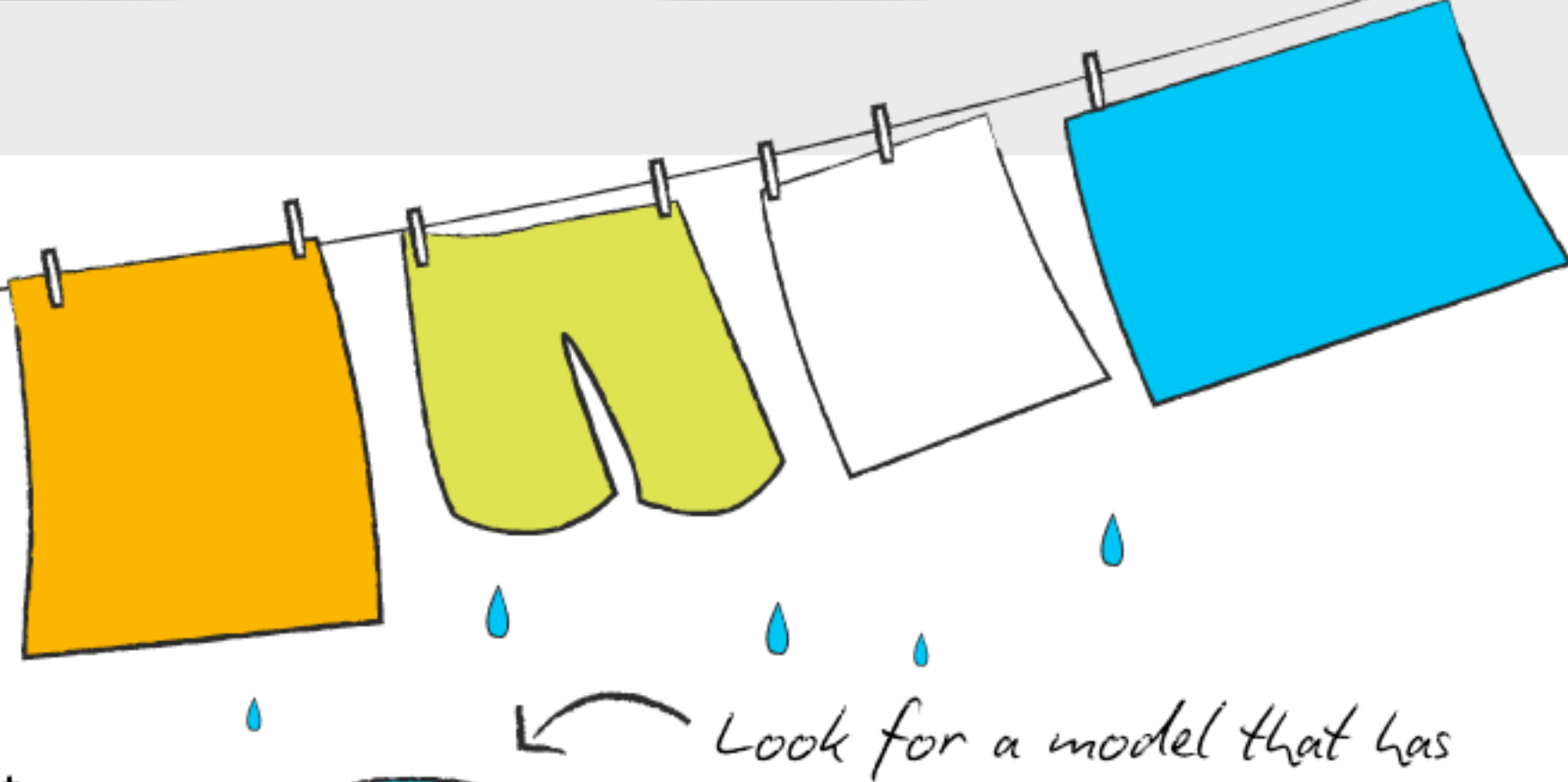


Washing 4x more spills and stains than an inefficient machine.

£94

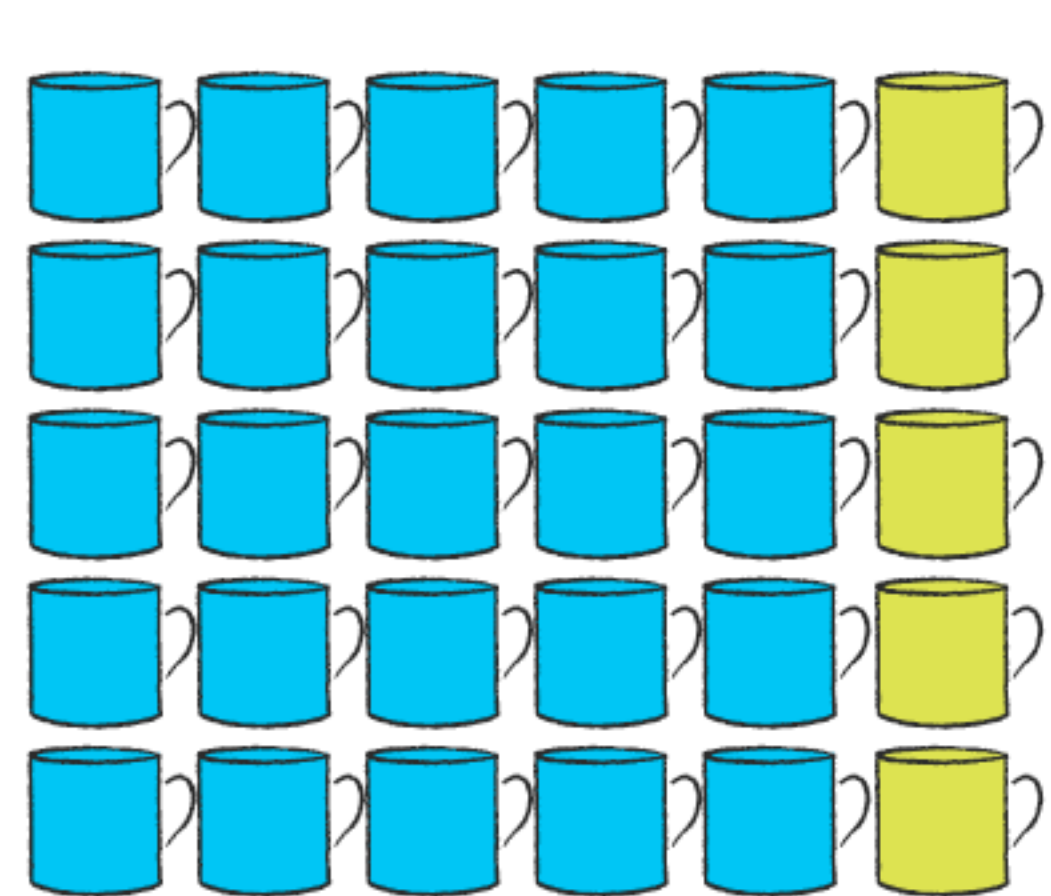


Look for a model that has a sensor to turn itself off when your clothes are dry.

Make 20% more tea using the same amount of electricity with an energy efficient kettle.



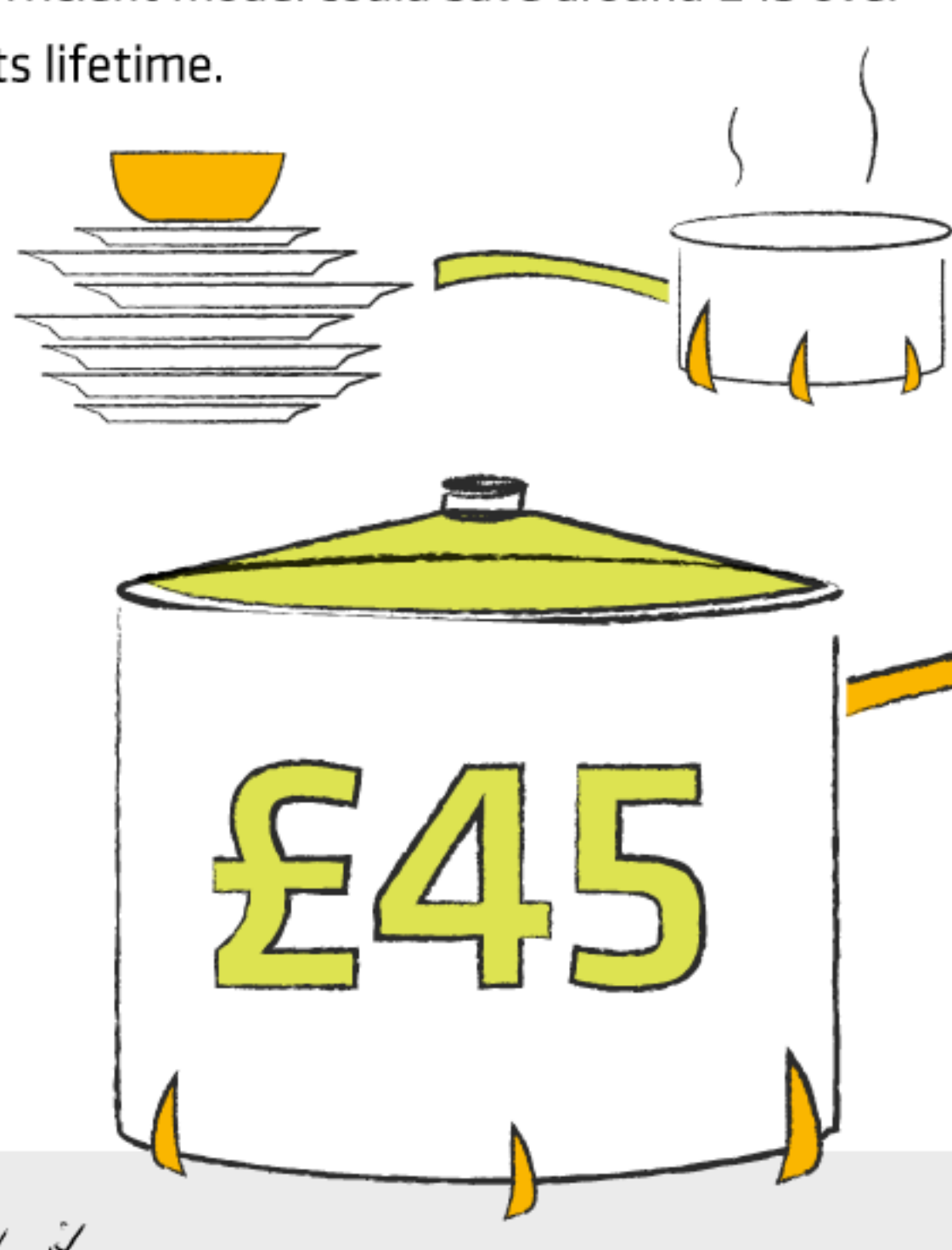

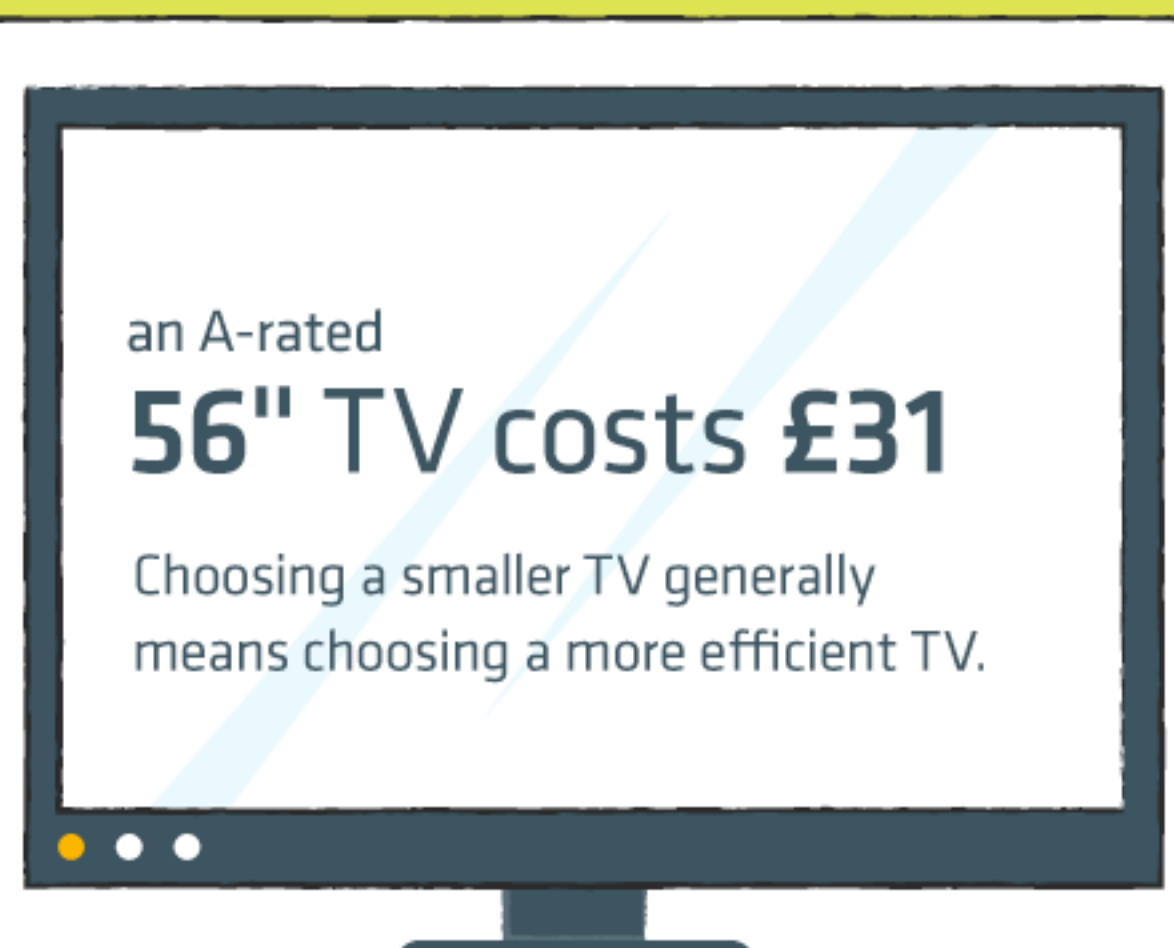
Cookers
